FENCING

GARDEN EZEE uses good quality timber, which has been pressure treated to enhance durability for all its wooden fence installations. However, wet rot is the biggest problem for wooden fencing. The following suggested tips and maintenance programme can help prolong the life of your fence for many years to come:

1. After installation, we recommend your garden fence, rails, panels, posts are sealed with wood sealer, stain or paint. A water repellent preservative may also be applied to the bottom lip of the fence.
2. Shrubs, flowers and vegetable plants etc. retain moisture as well as in the surrounding soil. Along with constant watering, these plants can make your fence posts more susceptible to wet rot. Avoid planting directly in front or along the sides of posts. Climbing plants can also cause wet rot to your fence, so if you do plant these, attach to a separate trellis so you can clean and seal the wood each time the plant dies out,
3. Check and maintain your fencing annually
 - ◆ Early Spring - to reseal, stain or paint panels, rails and posts
 - ◆ Autumn - to ensure there are no signs of rotten wood, which could make fence panels more susceptible to breakage or damage in high winds.
